## "Exploding Hope" - April 8-13

John 20:1-18

What term does Jesus use for his disciples in verse 17? What is new in their relationship from now on?

How has Jesus spoken your name in times of grief? How did it affect you?

What does it mean that Jesus is your brother?

What have you learned/experienced this Easter season that has been really special to you?

How can you live Easter as <u>more than a day</u>, <u>more like a destiny</u>? What steps can you take to make that happen? Who can you pray for that needs a resurrection in any form (spiritual, emotional, physical)?
